

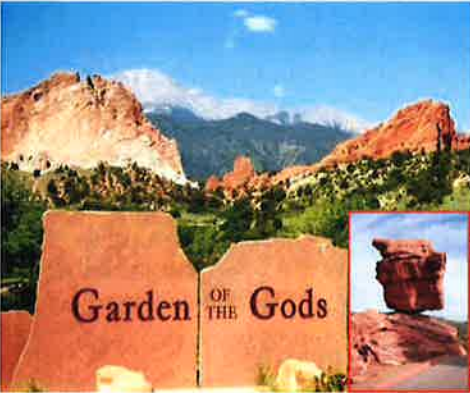

COLORADO

Plus Four Corners, Albuquerque, Palo Duro & Oklahoma City National Memorial

14 Days - 13 Nights

The sample itinerary described below is approximately like the itinerary your group will be following during your stay with WHITE STAR TOURS. However, the exact times, days, and destinations may vary for your group.

Day 1 - Depart from your hometown and travel westward toward Colorado, to your lodging destination in the Columbus, OH area.

Day 2 - Continue west to St. Louis, MO where a “**Journey to the Top**” of the **Gateway Arch** awaits. Board the enclosed tram for a ride through the city’s iconic symbol for a spectacular view of the surrounding area before checking into your lodging in the area. (B,D)

Day 3 - Depart early this morning with a stop in Kansas City, MO for admission to the **Arabia Steamboat Museum** which depicts life on the Mississippi during the great steamboat age through the remains of the sunken *Arabia*. From here, continue to the Salina, Kansas area for lodging. (D)

Day 4 - Another full day’s travel takes you to **Denver, Colorado** where “**dinnertainment**” has been arranged at the famous **Casa Bonita**. Check into your lodging after dinner. (B,D)

Day 5 - Depart for a full day’s guided tour, starting at the Visitor’s Center in **Estes Park** and continuing through **Rocky Mountain National Park** with some of the highest mountains in the U.S. View alpine lakes, forested valleys, a wide range of plant life and perhaps even some native animals. You’ll feel like you’re on top of the world in this setting of purple mountain majesties! (B,D)

Day 6 - Leave Denver behind as you motor south to Colorado Springs. Visit **Garden of the Gods**, a 1300-acre park located at the base of **Pike’s Peak**. See towering red sandstone formations, and flora reflecting the rich diversity of the area. Continue south to the **Royal Gorge Bridge & Park**, where looking down is more impressive than looking up! **See a film, and ride the aerial gondola** that glides 2200’ across the gorge, over 1200’ above the Arkansas River. Lodging this evening is in Pueblo. (B,D)

Day 7 - Travel from Pueblo to Durango today. Visit the **Durango and Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad Museum**, filled with artifacts that tell the history of the city and railroading. (B,D)

Day 8 - Head to **Mesa Verde National Park**. Stop at the **Mesa Verde Visitor & Research Center** for information and orientation, then take the **Mesa Top Loop Road**, a six-mile driving tour with a dozen easily-accessible sites via short, paved trails. Sites include surface dwellings and cliff dwelling overlooks. Continue this afternoon to the **Four Corners National Monument**, run by the Navajo Nation. The monument marks the quadripoint where Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico and Utah meet! Lodging this evening is in Farmington, NM (B,D)

Day 9 - Travel this morning to Albuquerque. Board the **Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway**, on the eastern edge of Albuquerque, and ride above deep canyons and breathtaking terrain for a distance of 2.7 miles! Spend some time in **Albuquerque’s Old Town**, with dinner on your own this evening. (B)

Day 10 - Continue east to Amarillo, Texas. Visit **Palo Duro Canyon**, the second largest canyon in the U.S. and known as “the Grand Canyon of Texas.” Early Spanish explorers are believed to have discovered the area and named it “Palo Duro,” which is Spanish for “hard wood” in reference to the abundant mesquite and juniper trees. Lodging this evening is in Amarillo. (B,D)

Day 11 - Today’s journey takes you northeast to Oklahoma City. Visit the **Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum** which honors the victims, survivors, rescuers and all who were affected by the Oklahoma City bombing on April 19, 1995. Lodging this evening is in Tulsa, OK (B,D)

Day 12 - Continuing east, stop in Springfield, IL for admission to the **Lincoln Library & Museum**, dedicated to the memory of the nation’s 16th President. Return to St. Louis for lodging this evening. (B,D)

Day 13 - Return to the Columbus, OH area for your last overnight stop. (B, D)

Day 14 - A full day’s travel returns you to Illinois and home, sweet home. (B)
